Tuesday June 4th - Dartmouth Naval College

We have been able to secure a tour of the Britannia Naval College in Dartmouth. On this tour you will discover more about its rich naval history and view its remarkable architecture. To make the best use of the trip we have planned a coach drop us into Dartmouth town centre at the Royal Gardens with free time in Dartmouth before the afternoon tour. You will be picked up by coach at the Royal Gardens to go to the Naval College.



After the tour a coach will pick us up and bring us back to Exmouth coach park. There are toilet facilities at the Naval College, but no refreshments.

Important notice: An entry requirement to the college is that each person needs to bring some form of photo ID or they will not be admitted. This ID can be a passport, driving licence or a bus pass.

Health and Safety considerations: This is a walking tour, with steps to negotiate and no seating. Those with limited walking or standing capabilities may find the tour a strain.

No tickets will be released for this until the monthly meeting on 9th May where you can pay by cash, cheque or credit/debit card.

We are expecting a large uptake for tickets, so to purchase tickets for the Naval College after the meeting, email Lyn Holmes (vicechair@exmouthu3a.org.uk) to confirm availability. Lyn will email back with payment details; tickets will be allocated on a first-come first-served basis.

Wednesday July 10th – Cotehele (National Trust)

There will be a coach going to Cotehele, a National Trust property on the Cornish side of the River Tamar. Cotehele is a largely Tudor house with an extensive estate including gardens, mill and quay to visit. This will be a day for you to do and explore as you wish. Refreshments are available in the restaurant near the house, at the café on the quay and there also many quiet spots around the estate to enjoy your own packed lunch.

Health and Safety considerations: This is an old house with uneven floors, several sets of stairs and a relatively dark interior. The mill is about 800m from the house and the quay is about 500m. The general terrain is uneven with steps and slopes. There may be a shuttle service between the house, quay and mill but it is dependent on the availability of volunteer drivers.

Tickets for this will also be available at the May monthly meeting; there will also be a general mailing with details on how to purchase tickets.

Quilting fun sale of small fabric gifts

Our quilting group is a part of Exmouth and districts U3A. We specialise in designing and making quilts and donating them to local charities for them to raffle off and raise much needed funds. A lot of time and expertise is used by members in making lovely quilts. The last piece of work in making a quilt is stitching the three layers together. This is usually done with a special sewing machine called a long arm machine. We send our quilt away to be quilted in this way and this means we have to pay for the service. We usually raise our own funds to top stitch the quilts, but have accumulated a few this year. We have three quilts made that are awaiting assembling and top stitching. All the quilts are made by our group and through our subs. (£1 a session.) This sale is to help us to raise funds to top stitch three of our quilts to finish them, so that the charities can then raffle them off.

The chair of U3A has agreed that we can set up a table to sell some of our homemade wares at the next monthly meeting on 9th May. There will be pot holders, cushions, ornaments, aprons and fabric storage boxes for sale. Please bring cash with you and help support us complete our quilts and support local charities.




There are currently two ways to access our new website:
